Primary Function

The Fire & Life Safety (FLS) Inspector-Apprentice is an entry-level position participating in an on-the-job training program to learn to independently perform inspection duties. Close supervision is initially received from a Deputy Fire Marshal, who coordinates the employee's career development path through the use of position specific task books. As training and experience progress, the Inspector-Apprentice is expected to exercise increased skill, judgment, and independence in completing assignments. Employees in this classification will, on occasion, be required to work evenings or weekends for special events and may be subject to stand-by and call-out.

The FLS Inspector-Apprentice is expected to progress through a non-competitive, criteria-based promotional process to achieve the Fire Inspector I classification within two (2) years of assignment.

Principle Duties and Responsibilities

- Learns to perform fire and life safety inspections through a structured, on-the-job training program.
- Understands, interprets, and applies the Fire Code.
- Conducts business inspections in low- to medium-hazard occupancies.
- Advises property owners, and/or managers, of methods to improve life safety and abate fire hazards.
- Responds to public inquiries to determine conformance with applicable codes and regulations.
- Verifies the functions of emergency access features and equipment such as fire department key boxes, key switches, gates, and strobe functions.
- Assists with testing and maintenance of fire hydrants and other fire protection systems.
- Researches, analyzes, and reports on topics related to prevention programs.
- Delivers safety programs on topics such as fire safety, residential safety, fire extinguisher, sprinkler systems, and smoke detectors.
- Provides backup support for the FLS clerical staff as needed.
- Reviews plans for fire/life safety construction and fire suppression systems for compliance and applicable codes and standards.
- Conducts acceptance test of alarms, sprinklers, extinguishers, and other fire protection systems.
- Performs periodic follow-up inspections of new and existing buildings, structures, and installations requiring fire department clearances.
- Researches code violations, and provides direction and/or technical assistance for correction of identified violations.
- Assists the Community Relations Division in the preparation and presentation of public safety and fire prevention programs to civic, school, and community groups.
- Investigates citizen complaints involving fire and life safety and hazardous conditions.
- Oversees various code related issues as delegated by theFire Inspector or Deputy Fire Marshal.
- Prepares complete, accurate, and concise written technical reports and correspondence.
- Prepares and maintains records and reports.
- Performs other duties and projects as assigned.

Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:

- Ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships with property and business owners, coworkers, and the general public.
- Knowledge of, and ability to, document violations of laws, ordinances, and safety hazards, and communicate with the customer for resolution of the violations.
- Knowledge of, and ability to, inspect fire alarm systems with audible and visual warning signals.
- Ability to distinguish colors to read hazardous materials fire diamonds (704M), and to examine electrical or alarm panel wiring and panel status indicators.
- Ability to plan, organize, and integrate comprehensive fire inspection and code enforcement programs.
- Maintain knowledge of current methods of building construction and structural design concepts.
- Ability to prepare clear and thorough professional oral and/or written reports, correspondence, documents, and presentations.
- Conduct analyses and make accurate recommendations based on study findings.
- Ability to operate a variety of standard office equipment
- Ability to operate camera equipment.
- Computer skills in the various Microsoft Office Suite applications.
- Ability to learn and use specialized department specific software applications.
- Ability to read, interpret, and make recommendations from building plans and drawings.
- Exercise sound, independent judgment within departmental guidelines.
- Learn and apply the geography of the fire district.
- Understand and apply policies and procedures in order to perform the duties and responsibilities of the position.
- Ability to detect fire hazards, unsafe conditions, and practices.
- Ability to learn and use public education methods.
- Ability to prioritize work assignments and manage time efficiently and effectively.
- Maintains "fit for duty" status.

Minimum Qualifications:

- 18 years of age or older
- High School Diploma or GED equivalent
- Two years of face-to-face customer service work experience

OR

Any approved equivalent combination of education and experience

Must possess and maintain a valid Arizona driver's license with acceptable driving record.

Preferred Qualifications:

- Associate degree from an accredited college or university recognized by the U.S. Department of Education
- Fire Inspection and/or fire service experience
- Home/business inspection, construction, architectural, or engineering experience
- Experience in public speaking and/or teaching

- ICC Fire Inspector 1 (Exam) or Certified NFPA 1031 Fire Inspector 1 or DOD Fire Inspector 1 (Must obtain within two (2) years of appointment to the position)
- IAAI Fire Arson I or NFA Fire Investigation Course (Equivalent to IAAI Arson I & II) (Must obtain within two (2) years of appointment to the position)
