Search and Rescue with Hose Line

Standard:

NFPA 1001: 4.3.9 (2019 Edition)

Task/Performance Outcome:

The candidate shall demonstrate the ability to accomplish a primary search within an IDLH environment. The candidate must maintain team integrity in a vision obscured environment through physical touch, sight, or voice. All assigned areas shall be searched, all victims must be located, all victims must be removed, and the integrity of the team must be maintained throughout the assignment. The general safety of the team must always be maintained, and all PPE must remain intact throughout the assignment.

Required Personal Protective Equipment (PPE):

Full turnout ensemble, full SCBA ensemble, and on air.

Required Equipment:

- Radio for each firefighter
- Flashlight for each firefighter
- Irons to door
- Axe or Halligan interior
- Thermal Imaging Camera (Captain)

Critical Fail Criteria:

Failure consists of the following:

- Failure to be seated and belted upon arrival.
- Failure to wear the required PPE.
- Failure to physically address their accountability on the passport of their assigned apparatus.
- Failure to exit the apparatus safely and with three points of contact.
- Glaring, gross errors, as documented by the evaluator.
- An apparent lack of efficiency and comfort with the activity, as documented by the evaluator.
- Less than 80% of available points scored.
- Failure to locate and remove the victim if one exists.
- Failure to maintain team integrity.

Evolution Details:

The candidate will arrive on an apparatus and be given the task of fire control and primary search. The candidate will successfully deploy the hose line to the location of the objective, be in the nozzle position, enter the IDLH environment, locate any victims, and exit the structure safely and successfully as a team.
